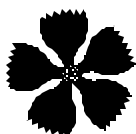

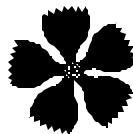
To you our old friends,

In The Beginning There were David & Kay Beard



Joan Romig is the Daughter of David and Kathryn (Kay) Beard. Her parents were members of the church when it was just beginning and are still members today. She attended church here with her family and later, raised her own family in this church. Her husband Michael Romig and sons Christopher and Kevin became dedicated and active members of this church. Joan read this at the anniversary celebration. It is not only a history of the church; it is a history of her family within in the context of this church.

Adelphi Presbyterian Church 50th Anniversary Joan Romig’s Memories September 25, 2005

When I was a small Child, my grandfather urged me to remember the family into which I was born and the religious heritage that was mine. Today, I am remembering the heritage given to me by the Adelphi Presbyterian Church family.

On April 17, 1955, I became a member of this church. Shortly thereafter, I began attending a newly formed Sunday school class. Dr Felix Juska was our teacher and was totally committed to his three students – Nancy Beard (my sister), Lorna Campbell, and myself. Dr Juska came to class prepared, cheerful and relaxed and had a marvelous sense of humor, so we laughed often. Each week we memorized three Scripture verses and completed a written homework assignment. The Scripture verses and lessons learned in that class helped dot anchor my faith.

At the age of 19, I taught a Sunday school class which included Gail Rodman, who is currently a member of this congregation. Years later, I taught classes which included Gail Rodman’s children. I was also a Sunday school Team teacher with my husband, father and good friend, Debbie Mangene.

One of my favorite church activities was being a member of the Naomi Circle, which met for Bible Study, prayer and fellowship once a month. The dear women in that group enjoyed having holiday-theme programs and sing-a-longs. A highlight of a St.

Patrick's Day program one year was being entertained by Juanita Guild and Margaret Smith dancing an Irish jig.

Ollie Mount joy was our "Apple butter Queen". Each fall, she would cook 45 BUSHELS OF apples in a huge iron kettle on the church property to make apple butter for the church yard sale.

I also remember the church craft events; it amazed me how Shirley Broughton and Ruby Guild could think of so many creative crafts for Sunday school, Vacation Bible School and Christmas craft workshops.

Cherry Smith taught us how to do American Sign Language to many songs including "Love in Any Language" which we presented at the International Dinner. I will always remember how dapper Richard Smith looked in his tuxedo while serving us pancakes at the Mother's Day breakfast.

Christmas Caroling, as the snow was falling with Joyce Maurice and others was meaningful and serene. We sang "Hark the Herald Angels Sing" approximately 20 times during the evening because it was Joyce's favorite carol! Delivering Meals-on-Wheels with partners Patty Masters, Albert Nixon and Fred Dolen was always a heartwarming experience. Any request for repairs or maintenance of church property was skillfully completed by Dudley Dietrick or Les Wattay.

And, whether it was quieting spirited children who were eager to perform, moving stage props, or retrieving extra bulletins, Chester Guild and Jess Broughton were there to lend a helping hand.

It was an honor to serve on the Worship Committee of Session with Gloria Dietrick. She was a wise and dependable Session member, and a thoughtful and loyal friend. I miss her 8:01pm calls inquiring as to whether or not I knew the answer to the final Jeopardy question.

Time limitations restrict me from mentioning the many ways in which Verna Juska served as secretary extraordinaire'. She was gracious to everyone who made a request of ANY kind and we appreciate all that she has done for our church family.

Adelphi Church has been blessed by the musical talents of each of our organists and choir directors. They have inspired us with their gifts of music and have greatly enriched our lives. Singing in the choir with so many individuals whom I dearly loved created cherished memories.

Our church has been fortunate in having devoted pastors who have tenderly guided their sheep. Each one brought unique gifts to us and each one is remembered in my heart.

Our family met Joe Condro when he came to Adelphi Church 30 years ago as a young pastor. He was approachable, caring and a great comforter. He taught us the need for frequent examination of our beliefs and attitudes and the importance of maintaining close personal relationships with God and other people. He urged us to grow in our faith through continuing education in Bible studies and other classes. He was a pastor of a church in Virginia when my husband became ill in 1995. Joe, Tricia, Ruth and Benjamin came from Stanton VA to Adelphi, so that they could spend an afternoon with us shortly before Michael's death.

The time that my personal family worshipped and served together will always be treasured. Kevin was baptized here; Christopher and Kevin attended Sunday school and were received into membership in this church. They served as treasurers, ushers and provided music for this church. Michael and I served on Session, taught Sunday school and helped plant and tend the church garden and deliver the harvest to the homeless. It was a fulfilling time for our family.

One of the greatest joys in my history here has been the privilege of worshipping with my parents, David and Kathryn Beard. It was from my parents that I learned the blessings one receives from regular church attendance, tithing, service in mission and a steadfast commitment of supporting the church through many transitions. I have often wondered how many tomato, pepper and flower plants my father and mother have lovingly grown and packaged for church yard sales throughout the years.

If you are here today in presence or thought, you have contributed to the heritage of this church and have left a great legacy.

Bible Breakfast Club met on September 18, with about 26 people in attendance. What Is The Presbyterian Church Doing To Help Americans?

GAUTIER - Volunteers have helped set up the first of 15 tent cities expected to be established across South Mississippi. The tent cities will house disaster relief workers from Presbyterian Disaster Assistance who will help Gautier and other cities on the Gulf Coast rebuild, said Lee Watenpaugh, camp manager. The workers who established the site came from the National Capital Presbytery in Washington, D.C. The campsite is on U.S. 90 at the Gautier Presbyterian Church, which had water and structural damage. The camp features open-air kitchen and dining areas with canned food and drinks, portable toilets and plastic-covered showers.

Watenpaugh said the tent city in Gautier is a prototype for the other sites, which will be determined by Carl Rush, program manager. The PDA has done mission work, but this program is the first for relief work after a major disaster, said project coordinator Greg Saunders. The aim is long-term assistance to help the Coast rebuild.

"Essentially, the direction is going to go west," Saunders said. "It's starting here, and camps are going to spot through the counties going west."

Watenpaugh added: "And we'll put up as many as needed and can handle the job."

The group will work with government officials and other agencies to identify what needs to be done, said Saunders, who will be replaced in about 10 days

Saunders and Watenpaugh said volunteers are church members of various denominations and are skilled craftsmen, as well as ordinary citizens who will simply provide "a strong back" for construction and other relief work.

"We are representing a specific denomination, but we are not here to help any particular denomination," Saunders said.

The tents sleep four or six people but will be used by three or four campers each, with several for couples. Volunteers will stay about two weeks and be replaced by others.
